The following Residential Clean Energy Tax Credit amounts apply for the prescribed periods: 30% for property placed in service after December 31, 2016, and before January 1, 2020

The solar Investment Tax Credit (ITC) remains one of the most valuable federal incentives for homeowners considering solar panel installation in 2025. Currently offering a generous 30% tax ...

For the tax year 2025, the federal solar tax credit equals 30% of solar installation costs, directly reducing your federal income tax liability. Here's an example of how the solar tax credit ...

Only certain solar equipment and related expenses are eligible for the 30% tax credit, so make sure to double-check what specific items fall under the ITC before you have anything installed.

The Residential Clean Energy Credit equals 30% of the costs of new, qualified clean energy property for your home installed anytime from 2022 through December 31, 2025.
