Do mobile phones need a radio base station?

Mobile phones and mobile devices require a network of radio base stations to function. Radio waves have been used for communication for more than 100 years.

What frequency does EMS radio communication take place in?

EMS radio communication takes place in the VHF low band, VHF high band, and UHF band. VHF low band is the radio frequencies from 32-50 megahertz (MHz). They are able to follow the shape of the earth allowing communication over long distances. These frequencies are more susceptible to interference from, weather, buildings, and electrical equipment.

Where are base stations located?

The network consists of a repeater and encryption capable base stations, mobile radios in selected official vehicles, . What is a base station antenna?

The base station antennas transmit and receive RF (radio frequency) signals, or radio waves, to and from mobile phones near the base station.
